Hi, I'm Tom. Do you usually wear a watch? I asked the students at our school this question. Please look at \*Graph 1. It shows that many students don't wear a watch now. \*Do you know why? I asked them the reasons, too. Look at Graph 2. More than 70% of the students say that they don't wear a watch because their \*cellphones can tell them the time. Almost 20% of the students say, "I don't like the feeling of \*metal or \*leather on my \*skin, so I don't wear a watch." 6% of the students don't even \*check the time. (1) \*I will tell you why.



( ③ ) I feel good when I look at such a beautiful thing. And a watch also shows a person's \*character and \*taste to other people.


Finally, you don't need to \*charge a watch as often as a cellphone. One of my watches has a \*solar battery in it. If you don't break it, \_\_\_\_\_!
