



So I said nothing and only *smiled. After I got home, I told my host mother about this.

*According to her, clerks usually say "Do you need a bag?" when we buy things. But they sometimes say "Need a bag?" in a *casual way. Then, I learned how to practice English from her. She said, "When you hear words you cannot catch, you should *ask the person to write the words in your notebook. Then, you can read the words in the notebook *aloud many times. By doing this, you will *get used to saying the words and listening to them." I tried her idea the next day. She was right. So I understand that

Today, I went to a store in the city. When I was walking on the street, a foreign person asked me, "Where is the station?" It was difficult for me to tell him the way, but I did so with a map I had and with *gestures. I smiled, and was happy to have communication with him. In fact, 3 was very surprised when he asked me the way. I didn't think people asked foreign people like me the way in London. But it is *natural for foreign people to have communication in English because many people from different countries live here together.

I still have some trouble with language in London. But it is necessary and interesting to have communication in my life. It is important to use words I've learned and to use other ways like gestures. These two things will make communication better.

I will write a letter to you again. I hope you enjoy life in Japan.
