



<最初の英文>

問6 次の英文は、高校生のユカリ(Yukari)が英語の授業で行った、「地産地消」(Chisan - Chisho)に関する発表の原稿です。英文を読んで、あとの(ア)~(ウ)の問いに答えなさい。

Hi, everyone. I'm Yukari. I live near our high school. Do you know a new *supermarket opened near the station two weeks ago? It's very large, and a lot of people do shopping there every day. I also go there almost every day because my mother asks me to buy something like eggs and vegetables.

Last week, I went to the supermarket for the first time. When I was walking in the supermarket, I found a big *sign at the vegetable *section. The word "Chisan - Chisho" was written on it. I also found a small sign near each vegetable. I stopped walking and read the small sign *for a while. Each small sign had a picture of a *farmer and his or her name. And it had a story about the vegetable each farmer *grew and the place of his or her *field. I learned from the signs that many farmers grew vegetables in my city.

Do you know what the word *Chisan - Chisho* means? Have you ever bought food *produced in your city? I asked all of my classmates these two questions. *Table shows the answers to my questions. From Table, we Table

can learn .

The word *Chisan - Chisho* means that, for example, a farmer in a place grows vegetables, and people living near the place eat them. (①) It doesn't take much time to *transport vegetables, so we can eat *fresh vegetables. Last week, at the supermarket, I bought some *lettuce a farmer in my city grew. It was really fresh and delicious. Also, we don't need to transport

food to *far places by plane or by *ship, so we don't produce CO₂ so much. It's good for the earth.

(②) I didn't see the *producing district of the food before, but now I always see it. Yesterday I went to the supermarket to buy some *chicken. I found chicken produced in Brazil, and it was *reasonable. But Brazil is very far from Japan. I thought a lot of CO_2 was produced to transport the chicken to Japan. So, I bought chicken produced in Japan.

CO₂ is also produced when we transport food by train or by *truck. More CO₂ is usually produced when we transport food from other countries to Japan than when we transport food in Japan. Please think that a lot of vegetables are transported from other countries to Japan. Vegetables are transported from fields to *ports or *airports in other countries by train or by truck, and then they are transported to Japan by plane or by ship.

Japan *imports a lot of food from other countries which are far from Japan, and a lot of CO₂ is produced by doing that. So, we should *reduce food imports and produce more food in Japan.
