


### 〈最初の英文〉

Anyway, I enjoyed the festival and wanted to learn more about Ainu culture. When I told my uncle about that, he gave me a book. I'm reading it at home.

Ainu people have a unique culture, but the Ainu population has been getting smaller. One \*study says ( ① ) now. Ainu people have their own language, but the number of Ainu speakers is very small. Some people say that \*only a few people can speak it \*fluently. I was surprised and sad to learn that. I'm worried that Ainu speakers may disappear someday. In fact, the Ainu language is on the \*UNESCO \*list of the World's \*endangered languages.

I hear there are about 7,000 languages in the world. About 2,500 of them are endangered. This table shows some examples of countries and the number of endangered languages there.

There are so many endangered languages in the world, and (②). I think languages are the most important \*tools for passing their cultures on to the next \*generation. So we can say losing a people's language means losing their culture.

What can we do to save these endangered languages? Seeing the case of the \*Maori language may give us a good hint. Maori is spoken by indigenous people in \*New Zealand. However, the number of Maori speakers once got smaller. Then, some Maori people were worried that the language \*might disappear and started making efforts to save it. For example, teachers started to teach it at school. The efforts brought success. The Maori language has become one of the official languages in the country, and the number of Maori speakers has been getting larger. Now the Maori language is popular even with people that are not Maori.

I hope the Ainu language will become popular like the Maori language. Now ( ③ ). I took some last month, and they were a lot of fun. If I become a good Ainu speaker, I'd like to communicate with Ainu people in their language.
