

問 8 次の英文を読んで、あとの(ア)～(ウ)の問いに答えなさい。

Mari : Oh, thank you! I like it, too.

Ted : I like my uniform now, but I didn't like it very much \*at first.

Mari : Oh, really? Why didn't you like it at first?

Ted : I didn't like the \*color of the \*tie.

Mari : You didn't like the red tie? I didn't know that. I think that color looks good with your \*navy blue \*jacket.

Ted : It looks good and I like it now. I thought the color of the tie was too \*bright at first.

Lily : What color did you think \*go well with the jacket, then?

Ted : Well... I thought \*grey would be good.

Mari : Yeah, grey tie will look good, too! How about grey and red \*stripes?

Lily : That will look \*even better!

Ted : Lily, do you see the school over there? That's our high school. I see Mr. Mori.

Lily : Who is Mr. Mori?

Ted : He is our \*homeroom teacher. Do you want to meet him?

Lily : Sure!

Mr. Mori : Good morning, Ted and Mari!

Mari : Good morning, Mr. Mori! This is Ted's sister Lily. We were just talking about school uniforms.

Lily : Nice to meet you, Mr.Mori. I think school uniform is a great idea.

Ted : Yes, it's a good idea. I don't have to think about \*clothes every day. But sometimes I \*get bored with wearing the \*same things all the time.

Mari : I \*agree with you, Ted. It will be nice if we can \*choose clothes to wear to school for some days.

Lily : That's true. But if you have a uniform, you don't have to buy clothes that much, right? Our school doesn't have a uniform, so I have to \*spend so much money on my clothes. \*Besides, uniforms look cool!

Mari : I \*have never thought about that! I \*have been wearing school uniforms \*since I went to a \*kindergarten. You have good \*points, Lily. I'm happy to hear a

different idea.

Mr. Mori : Listening to different points is interesting. Our school is thinking about a new  
\* rule from next year.

Ted : A new rule? Please tell us about it!

Mr. Mori : Many students said that they didn't like to wear uniforms all the time. The  
teachers and parents had meetings many times. We decided to start a new rule  
\* at last. It's called "No-Uniform Day".

Mari : So, we don't have to wear the uniform on "No-Uniform Day"?

Mr. Mori : That's right. You can choose your clothes on that day.

Ted : How often do we have "No-Uniform Day"?

Mr. Mori : The school \* hasn't decided yet.

Mari : I'm excited. I should start buying clothes!

Mr. Mori : Not too soon, Mari. You need to remember that you come to school to study.

Ted : Now, I'm worried. I \* haven't thought about clothes since last spring.
