Yuka, Nicole, and Takeru are high school students. In Mr. Goto's English class, they are having a group *discussion about reading. Mr. Goto shows the *graph to the students at first.

Mr. Goto: Hello, everyone. I know some students read books a lot and other students don't.

Please look at Graph 1 and talk about it in your group.

Yuka: OK, <u>the graph</u> is about the answers to the question, "How many books do you read in a month?"

Nicole: High school, junior high school and *elementary school students were asked the question.

Takeru: I'm surprised that elementary school students read books the most.

Yuka: They read the most from 2013 to 2021.

Takeru: *On the other hand, most high school students read *less than two books in a month

Nicole: I try to read three books in a month. But I can't do that sometimes.

Yuka: Wow, good for you, Nicole! I read a lot of books when I was an elementary school student. However, I don't think I read much these days.

Takeru: It's not just you, Yuka.

Mr. Goto: How is your group discussion going? Did you find any interesting things about the graph?

Nicole: Yes, we did. Elementary school students read more books than students in junior high school and high school.

Mr. Goto: It will be good if you can think about the reasons.

Yuka: Well, I don't read books much because I'm busy with several activities. I practice tennis after school. I also learn *tea ceremony on weekends.

Takeru: I'm usually busy with soccer practice. When we have a game, we practice every day before school and after school. Sometimes, I'm very tired, so I can't do my homework.

Nicole: I think most high school students are busy like both of you, so they don't have time to read. It takes me about an hour to come to school by train. It's my reading time. I think I'm lucky to be able to have time for reading.

Mr. Goto: You're right. Usually, high school students are busier than elementary school students. *Therefore, that is one of the reasons.

Yuka: Please look at Graph 2. I found it. This graph shows the reasons for students to pick up a book.

Takeru: I went to the school library every week when I went to elementary school because we had *story time. Sometimes, special *guests came to our school to read a book. They were very good at changing voices for different *characters, so I really enjoyed listening to their stories.

Yuka: *It seems like elementary school students have more books at home and school.

Finding new books to read is very easy for them.

Nicole: I think reading is a very important skill. To have many books at home and school is very good for elementary school students.

Takeru: Reading is great for us, too. *It's true that I'm busy with club activities, but I can *perhaps spend about fifteen to twenty minutes reading before I go to bed.

Yuka: That's great! I'm going to try that, too!
